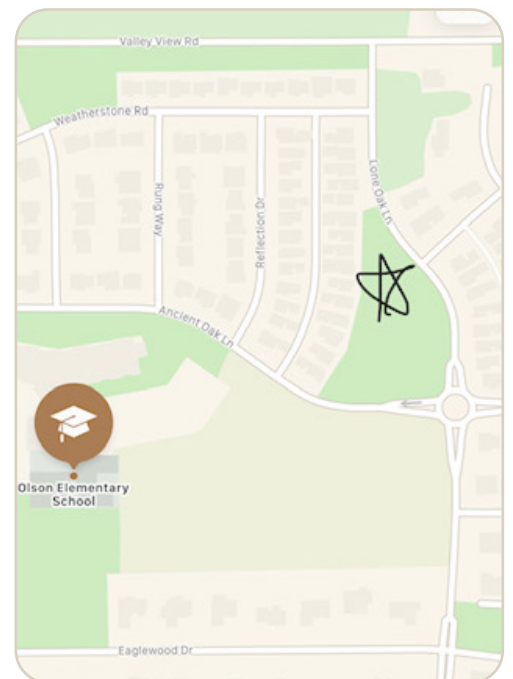
Tuesday, May 18: Pack Meeting outside at Badger Prairie Park in Verona (our typical meeting spot) at 6:30 p.m.
